The Covid-19 pandemic has not only affected the mudita school work functions and our beneficiaries, but it has brought many underprivileged people's lives in jeopardy. The second wave of COVID-19 hit India like a Tsunami. Every day, new COVID-19 cases were recorded. Thousands of people are losing their lives due to a shortage of oxygen. The threat of disease and increasing casualties are destabilising our lives.

Whilst this crisis has brought unprecedented challenges both for the people and society, life as we had known it before changed drastically. Recently imposed restrictions to daily life have forced us to quickly adopt different ways of working, learning, and connecting with each other. We at mudita school were forced to adapt to the new situation, and we did. We started mudita school in our beneficiaries' villages in the Amravati district which will help our children to stay in touch with education. We are doing emergency COVID-19 relief work through which we supporting daily wage earners and migrants workers. We are also providing mudita Happiness Kit to the most vulnerable children's who are deprived of education and nutritious food due to the COVID-19 lockdown crisis.

Here is a quick update on our work. Please read below:

Mudita School:

SHIKSHA NA RUKE (Education cannot stop):

One of the most affected victims of the COVID-19 crisis is children from marginalised communities who now have no access to schools and online education. Despite the outbreak of the virus since July 2020, we kept mudita school running in this vicissitude situation in three different villages, for our beneficiaries - maintaining protective measures and keeping our children safe during the COVID-19 pandemic. Currently we have 20 children (10 boys and 10 girls)

Nelson Mandela famously said, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world". And who has the power to change the world? It's thechildren of today, who are the adults of tomorrow. When schools close, children risk losing their learning, support system, food, and safety, and it is particularly caused great harm to the most vulnerable children. They are paying the heaviest price of the most jarring impacts of COVID-19lockdowns. We are at Mudita School trying to help the children from marginalised communities to keep them healthy and in the touch with education by distributing Mudita Happiness Kit which is packed with nutritious food items, immunity boosters, and educational materials. So far still today we have reached 535 children in rural area. Our aim to help 3000 children who are deprived of education and good food due to COVID-19 crisis.





Mudita COVID-19 Relief Work:

This second COVID-19 wave is spreading faster than before and overwhelming health care and other important facilities of India. Like before, the pandemic continues to derange people's lives in many states. Government-mandated lockdown leading towards massive jobless. Millions of dependent daily wage-earners lose their work, struggling to meet the basic food to survive this crisis. We are working consistently to provide COVID-19 relief support to the daily wage and migrants' worker from rural areas whose life is deeply hit by theCOVID-19 lockdown. As a part of the COVID-19 relief work, mudita school providing rations to support the most vulnerable families. So far still today, mudita school has been able to reduce the hardship faced by over 4,430 people (682 families) from the marginalized communities. Our goal to support 1500 families.
